COVID-19 restrictions put paid to the annual Spring litter pick for the last two years, but it's happening this year!

Tracey Kitto, vice-chair of Dobwalls Parish Council, says: "Unfortunately due

to the pandemic the parish council hasn't been able to organise the annual litter pick for the last couple of years.

"But we are extremely grateful to the Womblers of 'Wombling Free' who have been doing a sterling job keeping the village tidy.

"This year the Spring village litter pick is back and the council has a supply of hi viz jackets, litter grabbers and bin bags.



"All we ask is that you put the date in your diary and on the day bring along yourselves and a pair of gloves. And we're delighted some of the Womblers,



armed with their own equipment, will be joining us. We'll be meeting in the public car park next to the pub and look forward to seeing as many of you who can make

WOMBLING FREELY!

"WOMBLING Free" was founded on Facebook by two local schoolteachers - Oli Jones and Gareth Price. Oli, a teacher at Dobwalls Primary, and Gareth, who teaches in Liskeard, were appalled by the amount of litter on the roads and in the hedges when they went running along the Cornish Marathon route from Pensilva.

Oli takes up the story: "We headed out with some friends and collected five full rubbish bags, mainly drink cans, takeaway cups and lids, fast food packaging and so much more. Our numbers have now grown to over 600 with a group also starting up in Cumbria. We regularly support

community groups with the litter picking equipment which has been sponsored locally by Biffa and Howdens."

Wombling Free also deploys its "Hit Squads" which go out and tackle litter hotspots. Oli adds: "It has inspired the younger generation to get involved, with many families benefitting from exercise and fresh air as well as helping the environment."

Dobwalls school did a litter pick for an environmental day and pupil Tilly Day completed 100 consecutive days of litter picking and featured on BBC Radio Cornwall and Spotlight. Also, the school has set up an Eco Council of pupils who regularly litter pick the school grounds and are planning picks elsewhere.



TERENCE FRISBY, playwright, theatre director, producer and actor, who died in 2020, spent three years of his young life, aged between seven and 10, in the village of Doublebois as a war-time evacuee with his older brother Jack.

His close friend Jeremy James Taylor OBE, founder of the National Youth Music Theatre and its artistic director for almost 30 years, explains to The Villager how "Kisses on a Postcard" came about and how Terry's family and friends will remember him at a special ceremony in Dobwalls:

"The vivid memories of those years and the kind and generous people Terry encountered made a huge impact on him and led to the writing of an award-

winning radio play for the BBC in 1988 called "JUST REMEMBER TWO THINGS, IT'S NOT FAIR AND DON'T BE LATE".

I had listened to Terry's play about his "Vacky" experiences and one day, during a round of golf at Saunton in North Devon (we were both fanatical about the game) Terry was chatting about the piece and I mentioned the idea of turning it into a stage work — using lots of children's playground songs, wartime songs, Westcountry folk tunes and, of course, war-time songs. Terry, never one to miss an opportunity, leapt at the idea of a stage musical which he later mentioned to a mutual friend who was on the Board of the Queen's Theatre in Barnstaple – and the rest is history!

It opened to great acclaim at the Queen's in September 2002 and was revived 10 years later under a new name "KISSES ON A POSTCARD", also at the Queen's.

His warmly-acclaimed book of the same title was published by Bloomsbury and is still available. A brand new sound recording of the work has recently been made under the expert



supervision of Terry's son Dominic and will soon be available on line. Hopefully it may attract interest from a television or film company....who knows! When I first met Terry he was already a celebrated playwright, famous for his wildly successful comedy, the stage play "THERE'S A GIRL IN MY SOUP" starring Donald Sinden and the subsequent film version starring Peter Sellers and Goldie Hawn. Terry also wrote many other plays for the stage and television including two comedy series "LUCKY FELLER" starring David Jason and "THAT'S LOVE". Many may also remember him for his regular appearances on Playschool.

Terry was throughout his life a passionate enthusiast about natural history so when he died a group of his close friends, myself included, felt the wish to remember him — by planting an Oak tree in his memory.

We had no doubt in our minds where Terry would have liked it to be planted – namely in the community where those special days were spent during the World War II.

The tree-planting at Dobwalls will be a private event for Terry's family and



closest friends who are travelling from near and far to be there and we would like to thank Dobwalls Parish Council hugely for their agreement to allow it to happen in a place so near to Terry's heart.

It seemed like some kind of good omen when the council clerk Linda Coles told us about the exciting plans for planting a forest and I'm sure that those kisses which Terry and his brother sent on that postcard to their mother and father some 80 years ago would apply equally to a card sent today to the good people of the villages of Doublebois and Dobwalls!"

PARI SH PROJECT UPDATE - AND A TREE FOR THE QUEEN!!



THE Parish Council has purchased the land needed to create the carbonneutral community open space and forest in a field on the edge of Dobwalls.

Council chairman John Dunn has this update: Around1400 trees have been planted and the project management team can now finalise the layout of the rest of the site.

The plans include 15 special trees where people can place plaques in memory of loved ones, a wild flower meadow, orchard and shrubs.

A Darley Oak tree with a plaque will be planted by the council to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and we're hoping that ceremony can be part of the official opening of the open space, perhaps during the jubilee bank holiday weekend.


"To support the event and make it as profitable as possible, in terms of the donation to the Air Ambulance, we are looking for



Dobwalls and Trewidland Neighbourhood Development Plan

We're getting there - with YOUR plan

THE PLAN steering group has been working hard to complete all the documents for the plan which have to go to Cornwall Council. Once that happens, Cornwall Council will go through the documents before it sets up a formal six-week consultation period on the documents. Mhairi Mackie, the plan's co-ordinator, says: "This will allow everyone in former Dobwalls and Trewidland Parish, the area covered by the plan, to look at all the proposals and policies and for statutory bodies and other local organisations to make comments."



The final documents approved by the council, taking into account any issues raised during the consultation, will then go to an independent examiner. He or she will produce a report on the plan and any changes required by the examiner will need to be made before the plan can go to a referendum. All residents on the Electoral Register in the area of the old Dobwalls and Trewidland Parish can then vote on the plan. Only if a majority of those voting support the plan will it come into force.

Mhairi adds: "If the plan is supported at the referendum it will be adopted by Cornwall Council and become part of the official planning policy for our area, which includes all of the Dobwalls Parish Council and the Trewidland Ward of the St Keyne and Trewidland Parish Council.

"It has been a very long haul for all of those who have been a part of the steering group to get to this point, partly because of parish boundary changes and the pandemic. But everyone who has contributed to the process can feel that we have worked towards something valuable in setting out the ambitions for the future of the Dobwalls and Trewidland areas and their communities."

PARKING AT SCHOOL TIME AND TAMAR BRIDGE TOLLS

An Appeal from Cornwall Councillor Jane Pascoe

I have received many complaints about road safety issues on Duloe Road at peak school times—and so have the police and traffic enforcement. There's inconsiderate parking on the junction with the Highwood estate, causing estate residents to drive on the wrong side of the road into the path of oncoming vehicles. And cars are blocking private driveways.

So, I would like to ask for help from parents who drive their children to and from school. I wonder if you would consider parking in the FREE Cornwall Council car park next to the Highwayman and then walk to school.

There's a good footpath from Dawes Close to Tamblin Avenue and then the pavement up Treheath Road to near the school. It's not very far. This would vastly improve the safety of your children and ease the congestion at the school and the shop area. I would very much appreciate your help.

I'm concerned about the proposal to increase the Tamar Bridge tolls because many residents have to cross the bridge for their work, schools and hospital visits. Please take part in the consultation at <u>www.tamarcrossings.org.uk/funding-consultation-2022</u> We want you to have your say.



I'm delighted the parish council has completed the purchase of the two fields to provide more space for the football club and create a community open space. Dobwalls has a third less open space than other places of a similar size, so this will go some way to mitigate the impact of recent developments in the village.

The planting of so many trees will count towards the Forest for Cornwall. It's a great achievement for a rural village and I'm sure the community is looking forward to help create a space for nature.
