That questionnaire placed a value on me, based on what someone else thinks is valuable and attractive. However, as I grow older and less athletic my value would decline accordingly - until like the Beatles I'll be asking: 'Will

It seems that so often we find our value in what others think of us. how we compare with those around us. Television programmes like Bargain Hunt, Cash in the Attic and Antiques Roadshow and the National Lottery all tell us that we can be worth more, we just need to be 'in it to win it'.



## HOMES IN FIELD OPPOSITE DOBWALLS SCHOOL GET THE GO-AHEAD

DOBWALLS Parish Council has expressed its "disappointment" at the decision by a planning inspector to give permission for residential development in the field across the road from the primary school.

The inspector has allowed an appeal against Cornwall Council's refusal of an outline application for an affordable-led housing scheme of 24 properties on the land.

The parish council had strongly objected to the proposal on valid planning policy grounds.

The council chairman Cllr John Dunn says: "Obviously we are extremely disappointed by the decision because we did not consider the proposal was suitable or appropriate for that site or the village."



But Cllr Dunn was unable to elaborate further as he says he could not give any detailed reaction until the appeal decision has been discussed by the parish council. The monthly council meeting at which the decision has been considered didn't take place until after this edition of The Villager had gone to the printers, so we are unable to report the outcome.

However, by the time you read this the council and the Liskeard South and Dobwalls Cornwall Councillor Jane Pascoe will have given their views and the parish council's response to the planning inspector's decision will be on the council's website <a href="https://www.dobwallspc.org.uk">www.dobwallspc.org.uk</a>

## A VAST FOREST OF TREES AND LOTS MORE IN THE PARISH OPEN SPACE

A FOREST of more than 1,100 trees is part of the plan for the open space to be created by the parish council on the edge of Dobwalls village.

The council is buying two fields—one for the use of the football club and the other to provide an area for the local community to enjoy.

Council chair John Dunn is excited about what might be achieved in the open space field: "We are looking at approximately 1200 trees which includes a forest of more than 1,100 trees. The grass will be cut so planting can get under way.

"We're also creating a small memorial area where people who have lost loved ones can place a plaque in front of a tree. The open space will also have an orchard which we hope will include some Cornish varieties of apples.

"And we're hoping to enlist the expertise of the Lost Gardens of Heligan to



create a large wild flower meadow to attract bees and insects."

The remaining area will provide somewhere for people to sit and relax or to watch their children play, with some benches and a couple of picnic tables, and it could also be used to host parish and village events.

The other field will be developed and co-ordinated by the trustees of the football club and will be funded from grants secured from various sources. The field will provide a number of additional sports pitches. Once they are ready, anyone wishing to use them can contact the football club to find out how to go about making use of the facilities.

(The purchase of the fields has been progressing in recent weeks)


