### MEMORIAL BENCH VANDALISED AT JUBILEE COMMUNITY FIELD

PEOPLE in the village and the parish of Dobwalls have been horrified by the vandalism committed to a family's

memorial bench in the community field.

Words like "disgraceful", "deplorable", "unthinkable", "pointless", "thoughtless", "insensitive" have been used. Some other comments are unprintable in what is a parish and family magazine.

What makes this act all the more unbelieveable is that this bench is dedicated to the memory of someone who died in the most tragic of circumstances.

Considerable force would have been used to break the arm of the bench, made of heavy-duty recycled plastic.

The chairman of the parish council John Dunn quite rightly takes the view that, if it

was an accident, surely the person responsible would come forward and offer to meet the cost of replacing the arm.

John says: "I cannot understand why an individual or individuals think it is okay to cause such wanton damage. Don't let them ruin things for the community. Please come forward if you have any information.

"The police have been informed and we have asked them to visit the site at random times and, of course, to bring a prosecution for criminal damage should they find the perpertrator or perpertrators.

"A considerable amount of work and funding has gone into creating the Dobwalls Jubilee Community Field for the benefit of everyone in the community to enjoy and it has only been open a few months.

"However, if we need to install cameras to protect this community facility, we will do so."

### IT'S THE END OF DOBWALLS GIRLS' BRIGADE AFTER ALMOST 60 YEARS!

1st DOBWALLS Company Girls' Brigade is being disbanded. Formed in 1963, it celebrated its Golden anniversary in 2013.

The company numbers have fluctuated up and down over the years, but then along came Covid.

The leaders say: "The company stopped meeting at the beginning of the pandemic. Two of the three leaders had already indicated that they were



standing down so, without new leaders coming forward, it was decided, regrettably, that there was no way we could continue.

"Also, unfortunately, it's highly unlikely that anyone will come forward in the immediate or foreseeable future to enable the company to be reformed."

The news has been greeted with sadness by the Girls' Brigade at a national level.

Eleanor Bennett, of behalf of Girls' Brigade England and Wales, comments: "We're very sad to hear the group is closing, but understand the difficulties the past few years have presented for GB groups. We



thank the groups. We thank the group leaders and the church for their continued support for 1<sup>st</sup> Dobwalls Girls' Brigade over the years."



The leaders and Dobwalls United Church will receive a formal "thank you" from Girls' Brigade England and Wales when the closure of the group has been finalised.

#### WATER POVERTY, BILLS AND DEBT-GET HELP IF YOU NEED IT

HOLLY Pook is a Community and Customer Liaison Officer at South West Water. Her job is to help customers who are deemed as being in water poverty and those struggling with paying their bills and with a build-up of debt.

Holly says: "Since Covid, and especially during these financially difficult times, we would like to reach those customers who wouldn't necessarily contact us for help out of fear or nervousness, and try to put their minds at ease by offering our help.

"We have two excellent tariffs for those on means tested benefits which could offer a percentage of up to 85% off their water bills and a low fixed rate tariff. We also have debt plans available which include South West Water helping pay off any arrears on their account and grants to wipe it out completely.

"My aim is to get the word out about the help we can provide and make a difference by providing the support vulnerable people need."



### DOBWALLS MEMORIAL HALL - AN UPDATE

HALL trustees treasurer Alison Butterworth writes: "Over the past three years the hall has faced some very tough times-and some very good times! Unlike many other places, as a business, the hall fared well over the Covid period, mainly due to the grants which the government set up with the Cornwall Council to pass on to businesses. The hall trustees decided the money should be used to upgrade some of the more out-of-date equipment.

Just after the pandemic began the upper ceiling (the original one that was flush with the roof) came down and damaged the suspended ceiling. The hall now has a new suspended ceiling, three new heaters and a new boiler. It's also had a little exterior paint job. There is still much to do and we would like to upgrade the kitchen.

The goodwill and general attendance at the hall by local people is an absolute necessity if we are to move forward with future plans, especially to maintain the car park.

We have paused the craft fairs at the moment as there is a general lack of footfall at these events in Cornwall, due possibly to the monumental cost-



of-living crisis. But the exercise groups and the bingo sessions are doing very well and attendance is good.

At our annual general meeting we said 'farewell' to a very long-standing trustee Roger Williams-you may have heard of him! Roger has been a trustee for so many years I think he may actually have been born there.Our absolute thanks go to Roger and the long-suffering Grace. Roger is an absolute gentleman but has a voice when he needs to use it and has always been a voice of reason at the monthly meetings. We will miss you Roger,THANK YOU.

There are a couple of spaces left on the board of trustees and it would be great to bring the average age down to below 60. #### SEAN JACKSON STEPS OUT AGAIN

Route 2 – Havett Farm Loop. Distance – 2.5 miles/4 km approx. Time – 1.5 to 1.75 hours. Difficulty – Moderate, due to steepish hill near the footbridges, some areas being overgrown and having to walk in fields which have crops in them. Pram friendly – No.

The route follows Cornwall Council paths 607/12 and 607/13. More information can be found on the Cornwall Council interactive map:

Sean says: "Just a quick word of warning as at the time I walked the route some of the fields had crops in them so it is advisable to wear long trousers!"

From the Highwayman head east to the two mini roundabouts on the main road, then turn left and head north up Havett Road towards the bridge over the bypass. Just after the bridge on the right there is a Public Right of Way (PRoW) entrance which is not signposted but is open and leads to a gate.



Once through the gate you are on working farmland, so please be respectful. From the gate head towards the mast as this is the exit point. At the mast you will cross a possible electric fence before getting to the farm gate. After leaving the field via the

gate turn right (east) towards Havett Farm. Walk past the farmhouse and through the gate. Look to your left (north) and just before the big barn there is an access gate into the field. On a few occasions when entering I have



been greeted by sheep, so be careful to make sure the gate is closed behind you.

At the end of the barn building look right and you should see a fence line/gate which has the PRoW sign showing where you should go. Once through this gate look across the field and you should be able to

see a footpath so make your way across to the fence line. Here you should



turn left (north) and follow the fence line down until you find a stile. Be careful here as it needs a bit of TLC and the area is slightly overgrown.

Make your way to the new bridge which has recently been installed by Cornwall Council.

This is the hardest part of the walk as there are steep slopes either side of the bridge. After crossing the bridge, climb up the hill, keeping the hedge/ fence on your right, to another stile. After climbing over the stile, you may find yourself in a field of crops so where you would normally walk in a north-





east direction you now have to follow the field edge to the left of the field all the way round to the gate across from the entrance to West Tuelmenna.

You should turn left (north-west) here, but vou should take a moment to admire the

view of the Liskeard viaduct from the gate opposite. The walk along the road is about 600 metres where you'll find a stone stile on your left across from an old track entrance which, again, is not signposted.

You would normally make your way south through the first field (head towards the big tree)

towards Havett Farm and find the gap in the first hedge row. Once through the gap continue south through the second field where you will find a further stile/bridge hidden in the hedgerow. These fields were arable land so had



crops in them, meaning we had to follow the field edge or tractor tracks all the way around both fields on the left until we found the stile/ bridge.

Here you will see the barn you walked past on the way out, so head



towards that. Once back at the barn, retrace your steps back to the Highwayman Pub.Be safe and remember the Country Code and respect it. It would be great to get your feedback on the walks, the state of the other PRoWs and, of course, any

suggestions





#### DOBWALLS AND TREWIDLAND NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN UPDATE

THE plan steering group is finalising the documents to send to Cornwall Council, but everyone will still have a chance to make comments on the plan.

The documents form the submission for the proposed plan and after the submission is made all the documents can be found on the plan website at <a href="http://www.dobwallstrewidlandplan.org.uk">www.dobwallstrewidlandplan.org.uk</a>

So, after everything goes to Cornwall Council it will carry out all sorts of checks on the documents before it sets up a formal six week public consultation on the proposals. This allows everyone in the plan area to see and give feedback on all the proposals and policies and for satutory bodies and other local organisations to make comments.



The final Cornwall Council approved documents will then be sent to an independent examiner who will check and report his/her findings. If they require any changes to the documents these will need to be made before the plan goes to a referendum.
