THE NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN - IT'S GETTING THERE!

MHAIRI Mackie, the plan co-ordinator, has this update: After the full submission to Cornwall Council of Dobwalls and Trewidland Neighbourhood Development Plan documents in the last week of October, things went quiet until mid-January.

But now we have had several emails from Cornwall Council Neighbourhood Planning officers with minor requests for clarification, which have all been dealt with rapidly. We believe Cornwall Council is now carrying out the legal compliance check, which they must do before completing a comprehensive impact check on the plan proposals, after which an Independent Examiner

will be appointed to review the plan.

The public consultation on the plan is unlikely to start before the end of March or into April. This means the referendum on the NDP is unlikely to be held before the summer.



PARISH LITTER PICK 2023

Dobwalls Into **G**ardening



DIG, Dobwalls Into Gardening, your local gardening club, has started up again after the Covid pandemic and has a full programme for 2023, including a special plant sale in May. New members are always welcome, whether they know a lot, or nothing, about gardening!

DIG began in 2004 when local resident, Pam Jarvis, asked around to see if a gardening club could be formed. Sixteen people attended an initial meeting in February and 32 attended the following meeting and a committee was formed. The Parish Council gave the club a grant and a lady from Cornwall Council offered her help.

Club secretary Sue Gruzelier says: "The club presently has just under 30 members, mostly hobby gardeners, but some members are professional gardeners and some have an interest in gardening and enjoy the social aspects of the meetings. There is always time for tea and biscuits at the end to give members time to socialise and there's a raffle to boost the club's funds.

"Members are encouraged to take part in the 'bloom of the month' with flowers picked from their garden or allotment and there are special daffodil and dahlia competitions, not to mention which member can grow the heaviest potatoes in a bucket!"

DIG meets on the first Monday of the month from 7.00pm to 9.00pm in Dobwalls United Church hall. Most of the meetings involve invited speakers and there are organised visits to gardens or places of interest.

Every year there's a Christmas dinner and the club donates to a local charity annually.

PROGRESS TOWARDS DFC NEW FACILITIES

DOBWALLS Football Club is gearing itself up to expand its facilities, once planning permission is given for the change of use of an agricultural field across the lane from the club to be used for sports and recreation.

The field is one of two bought by Dobwalls Parish Council and the

council gifted the field to the club. The other has become the Dobwalls Jubilee Community Field.

Club secretary Andy Yeatman says: "Once we've got the planning permission it will be all hands to the pump as the ground preparation will involve removing stones, levelling, seeding, weedkilling and fertilising.

"It's a process that will take some time but eventually we hope to have much needed extra space for football, one full-size pitch and several smaller ones suitable for the different age groups of the junior teams. We hope the extra room will benefit not only our club but the wider community as





Weather permitting, the football season for the two adult sides at Lantoom Park will draw to a close by late April. The first team has three home Kitchen Kit South West Peninsula League games in March. These are 3.00pm kick offs against Newquay, St Austell and

Bude on the 11th, 18th and 25th respectively.

There will also be Duchy League games for the second team on several other Saturdays in March and April. Also on the fixtures front, Lantoom Park has been chosen by Cornwall FA to host the Intermediate Cup Semi Final between Foxhole and St Dominick on Tuesday April 18 at 7.30pm.

Next season, the South West Peninsula League merges with the Western League to become the Western Peninsula League with four divisions stretching from Land's End to Bristol. Andy comments: "Thankfully it is likely to be regionalised so it shouldn't involve a lot more travelling, but it will be an opportunity to visit and host some new clubs."

DISNEY COMES TO DOUBLEBOIS?

IN THE Christmas edition of The Villager, Dobwalls resident and historian Adrian Wilton took us back almost 100 years to pantomime time in what was then the music room at Doublebois House. Now it's a gym and games room

as part of the Hoburne holiday complex.

Adrian's article prompted Brian Jewell, from Trevelmond, to write in giving us his memories of when he lived in Doublebois a good 25 years after that Christmas pantomime:

"The main room was, in fact, a sprung dance floor with limited space under it. There were curtains



on the stage, probably the originals, with dressing rooms behind. Somewhere under the stage and dressing rooms was a bar. On the walls there were paintings of Disney cartoon characters.

It was about 70 years later I was told they had actually been painted by the original Disney artists.

Dobwalls School once used the music room for a Christmas concert. It was probably all the chairs from the school that were sent out on the horse and cart to be used for the concert.

Schoolmaster Rogers said: 'Anyone from Doublebois can ride home on the cart.' Yea, that was me! However, it would have been quicker to walk! Before or after that occasion, I don't recall when, I went to a film show in the music room. The film was, I think, titled 'The Yearling'. I remember it being a sad story, involving a young deer. Google has just confirmed that!

My last visit there was shortly before moving away from Doublebois. I remember feeling guilty about being there when the new owner dropped by! That was George Hamlyn's father."

John Dunn, the chairman of Dobwalls Parish Council says: "It will grow in stature in the years and decades ahead."

And, a brief update from John on what else is happening at the field: "The forestry contractors have replaced around 150 trees which failed to take after the original planting. Also, a couple of information boards are being erected at the field.





Initially, the new dual purpose dog and litter bin, installed just outside the football club entrance and at the end of the lane leading to the field, proved a little bit too popular and quickly reached over-capacity!

The bin has been emptied and the parish council is in touch with Biffa, the sustainable waste management company, for it to be emptied on a regular basis.

John Dunn comments: "It's great to see that the vast majority of dog owners in the area are responsible and are using the bin! It's been placed there so it can be incorporated as part of a regular collection route."

LOCAL Cornwall Councillor Jane Pascoe writes: I'm always pleased to see the snowdrops and daffodils heralding the end of winter and the beginning of Spring. It is especially a relief this year, as so many people have faced difficulties in the cold weather with their escalating energy costs. There could be more cold weather, so please look out for anyone who's struggling. Remember the Community Energy (Winter Wellbeing) email advice@cep.org.uk

I would like to extend a huge "thank you" to Dobwalls United Church for hosting a warm place throughout the winter. The time given freely by the volun-

teers has been very much appreciated and I hope it has been a comfort for our villagers in these difficult times.

Public consultations on the proposed Cornwall Devolution Deal have been taking place all over Cornwall and the consultation questionnaire is part of that. A questions and answers event has been held in Liskeard public hall. It was well



attended and there were representatives from many of the rural parishes. However, it was disappointing to learn that only 4,000 consultation papers have been returned over the whole county. It will be difficult to assess the true wish of all the people of Cornwall with such a poor return.

If it is decided to hold a referendum, it is of paramount importance that all the people in Cornwall take part.

Cornwall Council is amending the car park tariff structure and the car parks will fit into three zones A, B &C. The charging car parks in Liskeard will be mostly B Zones and C Zone for Rapson's car park.

I made strong representations regarding the increased fee and the variation of the time charges which will be imposed. Thankfully, they have retracted the original proposal to charge until 6.00pm so there will be no charge after 4.00pm. Look out for the car park consultation online at Cornwall.gov.uk

This is due to be implemented in May, so please do take part and make your concerns known to the council.



Sean Jackson's Spring Walk 2023 - The "Flying Scotsman" is coming to town!



WHEN I discovered the "Flying Scotsman" train is coming to our neck of the woods at the end of April I decided to investigate some good vantage points to look out for this icon of the railway world. Also, due to the poor weather that we have recently had, I also decided that for this edition of the magazine we will have a go at making use of the quieter country lanes to avoid getting too muddy! I also took the opportunity to pop in to Penhale Pantry for a coffee.





Route 4 - The Trainspotter Loop.

Distance - Approx 6 kms.

Time - 1.5 and 1% hours.

Difficulty – Moderate with hill after the railway footbridge about half way around.

Pram friendly – Only the path from footbridge down into Moorswater could be a problem.

The Public Right of Way (PRoW) used on this walk is 607/20. More information about footpaths around Dobwalls and the local area can be found on the online Cornwall Council Inactive Map

So, from our usual start point of The Highwayman head east to the double miniroundabouts, check for the Penhale Pantry sign here. It's normally open Saturdays and Sundays and possibly school holidays.

Turn south down the Duloe road all the way to the railway bridge which is a good viewpoint for the train. There is a pavement up to the footy club entrance where you then need to use the road to the railway bridge. When using the roads it is normal practice to walk on the right so you can see oncoming traffic, but please be careful when on a road as some road users may not be expecting pedestrians, especially around the bridge.



Just after the bridge you will see a gate which leads on to the field at Penhale Pantry. There is a long patch of wild flowers on the left of the path which look great when it blooms. Continue up the path to the main entrance gates where you can rejoin the Duloe road. Thanks Penhale Pantry as this new path is a lot safer than walking in the road and there is ramp access at the entrance gates.



Once back on the Duloe road it is a matter of metres to the next junction where you turn left past the Penhale Farm entrance. Continue up that lane until you come to the next T junction. During lambing season I have been able to observe lambs being born in the fields when I'm on this part of the walk.





At this T junction there is a gate which gives a great view over the valley towards Liskeard and another location to catch a glimpse of the train. Turn right towards North Boduel Farm junction. It is worth keeping an eye out for deer in the fields to the left, as I have come

across them feeding there.

At the next T junction near North Boduel follow the road around to the left away from the farm. Approximately 500 metres down this lane you will come to a path joining the road next to a gate and a mystery door! There is a footpath sign here, but it can be hidden away in the vegetation so keep your eyes peeled. Take the path and you will find the railway bridge. The view of the Moorswater viaduct from the top of bridge is probably the highlight of the walk!



For me, this is an ideal location for a bit of trainspotting and certainly one of the best places to see The Flying Scotsman when it visits Cornwall!







Once over the footbridge head towards the far right hand corner of the field.
As always, be aware this field is sometimes home to sheep. Even from the middle of the field there is an excellent view of the viaduct.

along until you find the stile in the corner of the field. You will see the path leads to the road in the area of Lime Kiln House and is

When you hit the tree/fence line follow it




clearly marked.



Once on the road, turn left towards the Moorswater industrial estate. Be careful in this area as there are no pavements. At the Old Road junction you have the option just to come up the

Moorswater road or join the Caradon Trail and go under the A38 road bridge to get to the north side of the bypass, which is the route we have chosen.







About 500 metres from where you join this path and near the Looe Mills Farm entrance you will find a photo opportunity with a difference. Here a tree was planted and a plaque placed to mark the opening of the A38 Dobwalls Bypass.

Follow the trail up all the way to the next bridge on the A38. Two things to look out for after the houses and cottages at Looe Mills. Make sure you check the fields out on your right and as you approach the A38 access bridge as in the past I have watched a deer quite happily lying by a hedge for ages, even though the major road is so close. Secondly, watch where you put your feet as this area is a contender for the Guinness Book for Records as the most dog poo in one location!



Once across the bridge and on the Moorswater road it is a straight walk west up the hill back to the village and into The Highwayman for the usual post walk swift half or whatever! As always, mine's a pint of Guinness.

Be safe and please remember and respect the country code. It would be great to get your feedback on the walks, the state of the other PRoWs and, of course, any suggestions for future routes. So please send them to The Villager editor. Also, it would be



great if we could have any of your Flying Scotsman photos if you do get a chance to see it.
