THE chairman and vice-chairman of Dobwalls Parish Council, Cllr John Dunn and Cllr Tracey Kitto, have been unanimously re-elected at the annual meet-



ing of the parish council to serve another year in office. The positions are unpaid but involve a massive amount of their time and effort on behalf of the village of Dobwalls and the wider parish.

The council clerk, Linda Coles, is stepping down after more than eight years in the role. At the end of

the May council meeting Cllr Dunn presented Linda with a card, signed by all the councillors, and flowers to mark her retirement, although she will be staying on until the new clerk has settled in. And it only got worse, with torrential rain later in the day. So, it was a wise decision to postpone the festivities. But, now they're back on —

Saturday, June 17, the King's official birthday!

Dobwalls Parish Council and the football club have re-organised the event at the club, starting at 11.00am.

Council chairman Cllr John Dunn says: "It would have been a total washout if we'd gone ahead on the Bank Holiday Monday. So, it's fingers crossed for the 17th of June. It will be another special day for everyone to enjoy and remember, after we celebrated the Queen's Platinum Jubilee."



Commemorative "gold" coins will be presented to the children of the parish whose parents or carers need to bring along proof of an address in the parish. The coins will be giv-

en out on a "first come first served" basis.

The club is hoping enough teams will come forward — men, women, boys, girls, mixed — so a walking football tournament can be held.

Children's entertainment will include a bouncy castle and inflatables. Plenty of hot and cold food will be available and the football club bar will be open.

THE Coronation Service in Westminster Abbey was reflected in a unique event in the church the day after the crowning of King Charles III and Queen



Camilla. Church members were joined by guests from Dobwalls Parish Council, led by the vice-chairman Cllr Tracey Kitto, Cornwall Councillor Jane Pascoe and her husband Paul and representatives of Dobwalls Football Club and Dobwalls Into Gardening.

The service was led by Sheri Sturgess, a reader at St Martin's Parish Church, Liskeard, and included segments from the service



in the abbey. The lessons were read by the church senior steward Doris Taylor and her husband Michael. Sheri gave the sermon and also dedicated and blessed

a bible rest acquired by the church for the altar table to mark the Coronation.



The organist was Paul Fergus. The flowers were by steward Pat Rowe and the special decorations under the illuminated cross were gifted by steward Sandra Beeke. PARISH CLERK LINDA COLES RETIRING AFTER MORE THAN EIGHT YEARS

AS mentioned on Page 2, Linda is retiring. Parish councillors took the opportunity to recognise her contribution to the council's many successes over the years at the conclusion of the monthly May council meeting.

The council chairman Councillor John Dunn, on behalf of the council, praised Linda's years of service to the parish: "During your term in office you have helped us achieve a great deal. You were heavily involved in getting Wainhomes to allow us to divert the money from its intended project on The Green to allow us to purchase the land for the football club and the Dobwalls Jubilee Community Field project.

"You worked together with our Cornwall Councillor Jane Pascoe to win the Community Infrastructure Levy grant of £30,000 to enable us to create the project, which has been a major benefit to Dobwalls.

"I have been in the chair for most of your custodianship of the parish and it has been a pleasure to work with someone who has the knowledge of how Cornwall Council functions and the legal implications, should we ever contemplate making a wrong decision!"

Cllr Dunn added that Linda had been with the council right from the very start of its long journey to create the Dobwalls and Trewidland Neighbourhood Development Plan and he expressed the hope that the council would finally get the plan over the line in the very near future.

John concluded: "Dobwalls thanks you for your outstanding service to the parish and it's sad to see you retire as our clerk, but we know this was the right decision for you at this time. So Linda, thanks again for everything, and I mustn't forget to mention the two new village bus shelters you helped us obtain!"

Linda responded: "I have enjoyed my time as your clerk, but I know this is the right time for me to step down. However, I shan't be giving up my involvement with local councils entirely as I will be continuing as clerk to two smaller parish councils."

Linda has agreed to carry on for a transitional period to assist the new clerk in familiarising themselves with the role and getting to know the area and the councillors.

Sean Jackson's Walk for the Summer of 2023

SEAN writes: As the good weather is coming, I thought I would focus this walk on making the most of the lovely countryside and Public Rights of Way (PRoW) we have around the village of Dobwalls. The route was also chosen to highlight the fact that two bridge crossings have recently been repaired.

Route 5—Little Treburgey Loop.

Distance-4.25 km.

Time-1.30 to 1.45 hours.

Difficulty—Moderate, with a couple of steep slopes to and from the bridges.

Pram friendly—As the route is mainly through farmland it is not suitable for prams. Additional Information -

The Public Rights of Way (PRoW) used on this walk are 607/1, 607/7, 607/9 and 607/11

So, from our usual starting point of The Highwayman pub, make your way south across the car park to the path which leads you down to The Green on <u>Treheath</u> Road. At <u>Treheath</u> Road turn right (west) up to the <u>Pendray</u> Gardens junction.

At the T junction go right then first left up to the alley which leads on to <u>Tremabe</u> Lane. This section of the walk is in fact a recognised Cornwall Council <u>PRoW</u>.

Turn left and head south towards Bridge End Farm where sometimes you may be



able to pick up some free range eggs at the entrance. Cross the bridge in to the farmyard. Remember that this is someone's property, so please respect this. Here you should look right and see the footpath marker on the gate post. Once through the gate you are also now entering working farmland so please make sure you close any




gates you pass through.

The <u>PRoW</u> is in a south-westerly direction across the field but, at the time I walked it, there were crops growing so, following the normal practice, it is best to walk around the side of the field. Walk all the way round the field until you



are opposite the gate where you find a Cornish stile. Be careful crossing, as it can be quite difficult.



At the top you will find a gate to pass through. Keep the fence line to your right, as this will guide you to Caduscott Farm. At the farm the footpath markers show where you should go through the property. Pass through the farm and continue on this lane and follow it until you come to Little Treburgey.

Just after you pass the houses at Little Treburgey you will see the entrance to Treburgie Farm which, if you follow walks in The Villager, you'll know the path has been used before. The route is clearly marked so keep a good lookout for the markers and it should be easy to navigate through the farmyard. The



path at the farm comes out on working farmland, so again you can use the fence line to guide you to the next gate.



At this gate head north east to the next gate. You should pass through this gate and to your left there is yet another gate you need to use. From this point you can clearly see to the north the wooden gate of another recently repaired bridge crossing.

After crossing the bridge look up the hill and look for the metal rails of the railway bridge, another useful aid to get to the gate you need to use to get you on to Be-

neathway under the bridge. Follow this road all the way up to the Five Lanes junction on the main road. Turn right and make your way to The Highwayman for a well deserved favourite post walk drink, whatever your choice might be. Of course, you've guested it, as always mine's a pint of Guinness!





Be safe and please remember and respect the Countryside Code. It would be great to get your feedback on the walks and the state of other <u>PRoW</u> around the village. And, of course, please send any suggestions for future routes to The Villager.


